I need to know if an American citizen / immigrant would receive disability from the government. I qualified in the US for disability purely based on my status as a targeted individual with PTSD/TBI; the documentation does all the work. That would allow for me to afford rent and whatnot quickly. Then I had an idea of traveling to Russia and using the German courts to try to win a case where others have failed.

Dear Todd,

I am living in Switzerland, so I don't have a spare bedroom in Germany, unfortunately. I think as an American citizen, your quickest way would be to contact the German embassy in the US. They have all the info and maybe you can ask for asylum in Germany. In any case, they have all the details about who to ask about this.

The problem with me trying to investigate is that the German social benefit system is a labyrinth. It very much depends on your medical details, past history etc. There are so many things that I can't answer that I would be scared to give you false information.

I would do the following (moving to the next point if the previous one fails):

1. Call German embassy in US
2. Call German foreign office
3. Call German social security office and just talk to them in English
4. Try to find webpages about social security in English (there is a large expat community)
5. Call the local council of the city where you would like to move and talk to them in English.

Let me know if this helps.
